<i>Spirituality</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Children explore how technology makes the world a smaller place by connecting them with people and places. - Children investigate the potential of virtual reality through programs such as Scratch. - Children use technology to connect with the natural world and space; helping to develop a sense of 'awe' and 'wonder'. 	<i>Democracy</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Children take part in group work and collective enquiry. - Children share resources and turn take fairly.
<i>Moral</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Children explore issues linked to e-safety. - Children reflect on the accuracy of information they see or share online. 	<i>Rule of Law</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Children learn to use technology safely and responsibly. - Children report when they see or experience something online that concerns them or breaks a rule.
<i>Social</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Children make connections using online technology. - Children use collaborative tools to work together and learn from others. 	<i>Individual Liberty</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Children use software to present information and develop the tools they need so that they can choose how they wish to do this effectively.
