Erosion– a natural process where materials are moved and cause an area to be worn away

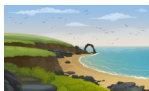
Cardinal point- each of the four main points of the compass (north, south, east, and west)

Structure-a combination of materials and/or parts to create a 3d shape

Joint– where two or more pieces of material are connected

Maths Terms

Polygon- Any closed two-dimensional shape with three or more sides is called a polygon. Triangles and squares are polygons, as well as more complicated shapes like a twelve-sided dodecagon.

Vertices-a point where two or more curves, lines, or edges meet



Musical Terms

Reggae- Developed in the 1970s and originated from Jamaica, Reggae defined by Bob Marley. It has a prominent bass beat and a strong off-beat usually played on the guitar.

Pulse- The heartbeat or steady beat of a song/piece of music

Rhythm- The combination of long and short sounds to make patterns.

Pitch- The range of high and low sounds.

Improvise- To make up a tune and play it on the spot



Computing Terms

Data-information such as facts and numbers

Pictogram- a chart or graph which uses pictures to represent data in a simple way

Attribute-a changeable property or characteristic

Tally Chart- a table used for counting and comparing the numbers of multiple classes of a data set.



PE Terms– Tennis

Forehand-a shot made by swinging the racket across the body with the hand moving palm-first.

Backhand- a stroke played with the back of the hand facing in the direction of the stroke

Serve-a shot to start a point

Volley-to strike the ball over the net before it bounces
